First Key Points – Evening/morning

1. The Genesis account for a 24-hour day always begins at sundown to sundown.
 - Genesis 1:5 And God called the light Day, and the darkness he called Night. And the **evening** and the **morning** were the **first day**.
 - 2nd day - Genesis 1:8 And God called the firmament Heaven. And the **evening** and the **morning** were the **second day**.
 - 3rd day - Genesis 1:13 And the **evening** and the **morning** were the **third day**.
 - 4th day - Genesis 1:19 And the **evening** and the **morning** were the **fourth day**.
 - 5th day - Genesis 1:23 And the **evening** and the **morning** were the **fifth day**.
 - 6th day - Genesis 1:31 And God saw every thing that he had made, and, behold, it was very good. And the **evening** and the **morning** were the **sixth day**.

First Key Point – Biblical examples of the sundown

Biblical Examples –

1. The Day of Atonement: Notice that Moses stated it was to be on the 10th day of the 7th month.

- Leviticus 23:27 “Also on the **tenth day of this seventh month** there shall be a day of atonement: it shall be an holy convocation unto you...”

Yet it was to begin on the evening of the 9th day to the even of the 10th day.

- Leviticus 23:32 It shall be unto you a sabbath of rest, and ye shall afflict your souls: in the **ninth day of the month at even, from even unto even**, shall ye celebrate your sabbath.

2. Nehemiah speaks of closing the doors to not defile the Sabbath.

- Nehemiah 13:19 “And it came to pass, that when the gates of Jerusalem began to be dark **before** the sabbath...”

1. The Genesis account for a 24-hour day always begins at sundown to sundown.

- The rabbinical view of sundown began at 6 PM.
 - The evening begins at 6 PM - “sunset” is used.
 - The morning begins at 6 AM – “dawn” or “day” is used.

Note: The Bible does not confirm or deny the two time periods of a day (6 PM/ 6 AM), but since the Word of God (“oracles”) was given to the Jews, it was their accepted view.

- Romans 3:2 Much every way: chiefly, because that unto **them** were committed the **oracles of God**.

The Romans initially divided the day from before noon to afternoon.

- The new sundial technology (circa 263 BC) allowed for the natural day from a 6 AM sunrise to a 6 PM sunset for 12 hours.

Second Key Point – Chronology of a Friday Death

2. Our chronology of the Passion Week is based on a **Friday** Crucifixion, which is the 14th day of Nisan (Month).

We are aware of the other views (Wednesday or Thursday deaths). They both are based primarily on one verse:

- Matthew 12:40 For as Jonas was **three days and three nights** in the whale's belly; so shall the Son of man be three days and three nights in the heart of the earth.

We have rejected those positions based on extensive Biblical research and will seek to explain all three views in later messages.

Bible verses agreeing with a third-day

1. “At the end of the sabbath, as it began to **dawn** toward the **first day of the week**” (Matthew 28:1-4)
2. Now **when Jesus was risen early the first day of the week**, he appeared first to Mary Magdalene, out of whom he had cast seven devils. (Mark 16:9)
3. Now upon the **first day of the week, very early in the morning**, they came unto the sepulchre, bringing the spices which they had prepared, and certain others with them. (Luke 24:1)
4. “The **first day of the week cometh Mary Magdalene early**, when it was yet dark, unto the sepulchre...” (John 20:1)
5. “Him God raised up the **third day**, and shewed him openly:” (Acts 10:40)

THE WORD "PASSION" IS LATIN – "PASSIO" ("SUFFERING" OR "ENDURING").

Passion Week

The "Passion of Christ" typically begins in the Garden of Gethsemane with His prayer to the cross.

- Matthew 26:39 "...O my Father, if it be possible, let this cup pass from me: nevertheless not as I will, but as thou wilt."

This time was His most profound moment of suffering, a pinnacle that forms the very heart of our faith.

- 1 Corinthians 2:2 For I determined not to know any thing among you, save Jesus Christ, and him **crucified**.

We will focus on that whole week.

Passion Week

His anguish and beatings, as was the nailing to the cross, were real and prophesied.

- Isaiah 53:4-12 **Surely he hath borne our griefs**, and carried our sorrows: yet we did esteem him stricken, smitten of God, and afflicted. (5) But he was wounded for our transgressions, he was bruised for our iniquities: the chastisement of our peace was upon him; and with his stripes we are healed. (6) All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned every one to his own way; and the LORD hath laid on him the iniquity of us all. (7) **He was oppressed, and he was afflicted**, yet he opened not his mouth: he is brought as a lamb to the slaughter, and as a sheep before her shearers is dumb, so he openeth not his mouth. (8) He was taken from prison and from judgment: and who shall declare his generation? for he was cut off out of the land of the living: for the transgression of my people was he stricken. (9) And he made his grave with the wicked, and with the rich in his death; because he had done no violence, neither was any deceit in his mouth. (10) **Yet it pleased the LORD to bruise him; he hath put him to grief: when thou shalt make his soul an offering for sin**, he shall see his seed, he shall prolong his days, and the pleasure of the LORD shall prosper in his hand. (11) He shall see of the travail of his soul, and shall be satisfied: by his knowledge shall **my righteous servant justify many; for he shall bear their iniquities**. (12) Therefore will I divide him a portion with the great, and he shall divide the spoil with the strong; because he hath poured out his soul unto death: and he was numbered with the transgressors; and **he bare the sin of many, and made intercession for the transgressors**.

Saturday after 6 PM, the 9th Day of Nisan Begins

Arrived in Bethany – 9th Day of Nisan

- John 12:1 “Then Jesus **six days before the passover** came to Bethany...”

The Passover Feast is on the 14th Day of Nisan – the year’s first month.

- Leviticus 23:5 In the **fourteenth day of the first month** at **even** is the LORD'S passover.

The month of Nisan is one of the few months mentioned in the Bible.

- Nehemiah 2:1 And it came to pass in the **month Nisan**, in the twentieth year of Artaxerxes the king...”
- Esther 3:7 “In the **first month, that is, the month Nisan**, in the twelfth year of king Ahasuerus...”

Saturday after 6 PM, 9th Day of Nisan

Arrived in Bethany – 9th Day of Nisan – 6 days before the Passover

Martha served supper prepared with Lazarus at the table.

- Mary took ointment of spikenard and anointed Jesus's feet.
 - John 12:2-6 There they made him a **supper**; and Martha served: but Lazarus was one of them that sat at the table with him. (3) Then took Mary a pound of ointment of **spikenard**, very costly, and anointed the feet of Jesus, and wiped his feet with her hair: and the house was filled with the odour of the ointment.

Spikenard is an expensive perfume

Old Testament use – It speaks of the love between a bride and groom

- Song of Solomon 1:12 While the king sitteth at his table, my **spikenard** sendeth forth the smell thereof.
- Song of Solomon 4:13-14 Thy plants are an orchard of pomegranates, with pleasant fruits; camphire, with **spikenard**, (14) **Spikenard** and saffron; calamus and cinnamon, with all trees of frankincense; myrrh and aloes, with all the chief spices:

Sunday, 9th of Nisan – Before 6 PM

A great crowd grew in anticipation of seeing Jesus and Lazarus.

- John 12:9-11 Much people of the Jews therefore knew that he was there: and they came not for Jesus' sake only, but that they might see Lazarus also, whom he had raised from the dead. (10) But the chief priests consulted that they might put Lazarus also to death; (11) Because that by reason of him many of the Jews went away, and believed on Jesus.

Most of Jesus' miracles were done in Galilee (far north). His raising of Lazarus was just 2 miles away and shook everything up.

- John 12:17-19 The people therefore that was with him when he called Lazarus out of his grave, and raised him from the dead, bare record. (18) For this cause the people also met him, for that they heard that he had done this miracle. (19) The Pharisees therefore said among themselves, **Perceive ye how ye prevail nothing? behold, the world is gone after him.**

Note: Our different view

Many Catholic scholars call Sunday “Palm Sunday” as they argue that Jesus’ triumphant entry into Jerusalem was on that day.

- That makes a nice connection, as Jesus also arose on Sunday, on the Feast of First Fruits.

Why I disagree.

- Jesus’ Triumphal entry could not have been on Saturday as that was the Sabbath day, and riding on a donkey was prohibited.
- At that time, Sunday had little Biblical connection except for the Feast of First Fruits and Feast of Pentecost.

Note: Our different view

- On Sunday, the text implies that many Jews became “believers” and left Jerusalem as they “went away.”
– John 12:11 **“Because that by reason of him many of the Jews went away, and believed on Jesus.”**

However, on the actual day that Jesus entered Jerusalem, our texts state that those same believers were rejoicing over Him.

- Matthew 21:9 And the multitudes that went before, and that followed, cried, saying, Hosanna to the Son of David: Blessed is he that cometh in the name of the Lord; **Hosanna in the highest.**

The Bible timeline also fits, so we reject a “Palm” Sunday entry.


The Mount of Olives And Dominus Flevit Church - Monday before 6 PM, 10th Day of Nissan

Jesus began the **Passion Week**, leaving **Bethany** and stopping at the Mount of Olives.


He is on the back of a donkey—as He will present Himself to Israel as their Messiah (Dan. 9:25; Zech. 9:9, 16; Matt. 21).

- He began the ascent along the eastern road to the Mt. of Olives en route to Jerusalem.
- Before he arrived at Bethpage, he sent two disciples to secure a colt/donkey. Jesus had walked 20 minutes from Bethany to Bethpage.
- He rode the donkey into Jerusalem at Bethpage (House of Preseason Fig).

Monday before 6 PM, 10th Day of Nissan

Jesus leaves Bethany and weeps over Jerusalem on the Mount of Olives. The question is: Why did He weep?

- Luke 19:41-44 And when he was come near, he beheld the city, and **wept over it**, (42) Saying, **If** thou hadst known, even thou, at least in this thy day, the things which belong **unto thy peace!** but now they are **hid from thine eyes**. (43) For the days shall come upon thee, that thine enemies shall cast a trench about thee, and compass thee round, and keep thee in on every side, (44) And shall **lay thee even with the ground**, and thy children within thee; and they **shall not leave in thee one stone upon another**; be [destruction of the Temple Mount – 70 AD]; cause thou **knewest not the time of thy visitation.**

Why did Jesus weep over Jerusalem?

The prophecy of Daniel 9 states that the Messiah would **officially present Himself to Israel** in the first 483 years or 69 weeks. **How do we know this?**

1. Jesus did this in Luke 19:37-38/ Matthew 21:5

- Luke 19:37-38 And when he was come nigh, even now **at the descent of the mount of Olives**, the whole multitude of the disciples began to rejoice and praise God with a loud voice for all the mighty works that they had seen;³⁸ **Saying, Blessed be the King that cometh in the name of the Lord: peace in heaven, and glory in the highest.**
- Matthew 21:5 Tell ye the daughter of Sion, Behold, **thy King cometh unto thee**, meek, and sitting upon an ass, and a colt the foal of an ass.

What day?

Why the **day** that God had fixed in Daniel 9:25's prophecy, the day that **belonged to Israel**, the day on which **their Messiah** would come as the "Prince"!


- Daniel 9:25 Know therefore and understand, that from the going forth of the commandment to restore and to build Jerusalem **unto the Messiah the Prince shall be seven weeks, and threescore and two weeks [69th week]**: the street shall be built again, and the wall, even in troublous times [*Yes, it was troublous times as Rome was in control*].


What about "the things which belong unto thy peace" (Luke 19:42)?

- Now it is **hidden from their eyes** as their enemies will prevail over them and the city will be destroyed again.
 - Isaiah 6:8-10 Also I heard the voice of the Lord, saying, Whom shall I send, and who will go for us? Then said I, Here am I; send me. (9) And he said, Go, and **tell this people**, Hear ye indeed, but understand not; and see ye indeed, but perceive not. (10) **Make the heart of this people fat, and make their ears heavy, and shut their eyes; lest they see with their eyes, and hear with their ears, and understand with their heart, and convert, and be healed.**
- **But Why? –**
 - "because thou knewest not the time of thy **visitation**." (Luke 19:44)

Passion Week – Why did Jesus weep over Jerusalem?

Wept over Jerusalem – One last MAJOR POINT

- Matthew 23:37-39 O Jerusalem, Jerusalem, thou that killest the prophets, and stonest them which are sent unto thee, how often would I have gathered thy children together, even as a hen gathereth her chickens under her wings, and **ye would not!** (38) Behold, your house is left unto you desolate. (39) **For I say unto you, Ye shall not see me henceforth, till ye shall say, Blessed is he that cometh in the name of the Lord.**
 - This happens at the end of the seven-year Tribulation period as Romans 11:26 states, “all Israel shall be saved.”

Monday before 6 PM, 10th Day of Nissan

Triumphal Entry into Jerusalem on a donkey - Crowds shout
“Hosanna”

- Matthew 21:1-9 And when they drew nigh unto Jerusalem, and were come to Bethphage, unto the mount of Olives, then sent Jesus two disciples, (2) Saying unto them, Go into the village over against you, and straightway ye shall find an ass tied, and a colt with her: loose them, and bring them unto me.... (4) **All this was done, that it might be fulfilled which was spoken by the prophet, saying,** (5) Tell ye the daughter of Sion, Behold, thy King cometh unto thee, meek, and **sitting upon an ass, and a colt the foal of an ass**....(8) And a very great multitude spread their garments in the way; others cut down branches from the trees, and strawed them in the way. (9) **And the multitudes that went before, and that followed, cried, saying, Hosanna to the Son of David: Blessed is he that cometh in the name of the Lord; Hosanna in the highest.**

Monday before 6 PM, 10th Day of Nissan - Triumphal Entry into Jerusalem on a donkey

This was the “Picking of the lamb” day! – When you got your lamb!

Old Testament – It was this day you were to get your lamb:

- Exodus 12:3 “Speak ye unto all the congregation of Israel, saying, In the **tenth day of this month** they shall take to them every man a lamb...”

Jesus was telling everyone, PICK ME...PICK ME!!

- Exodus 12:6 And ye shall keep it up until the **fourteenth day of the same month**: and the whole assembly of the congregation of Israel **shall kill it in the evening**.
- [Caesarea Philippi] Matthew 16:21 From that time forth began Jesus to shew unto his disciples, how that he must go unto Jerusalem, and suffer many things of the elders and chief priests and scribes, and **be killed, and be raised again the third day.**

Old Testament Spoke of this Day!

Adam and Eve were clothed/covered by a lamb.

- Genesis 3:21 Unto Adam also and to his wife did the LORD God make coats of skins, and clothed them.

Because of sin, something not of their own making had to die.

- Isaiah 61:10 I will greatly rejoice in the LORD, my soul shall be joyful in my God; **for he hath clothed me with the garments of salvation, he hath covered me with the robe of righteousness**, as a bridegroom decketh himself with ornaments, and as a bride adorneth herself with her jewels.

Old Testament Spoke of this Day!

Abraham brought his son Isaac to Mt. Moriah:

- He told his servants:
 - Genesis 22:5 And Abraham said unto his young men, Abide ye here with the ass; and I and the lad will go yonder and worship, and **come again to you**.

Called the “binding of Isaac” (הַעֲקִידָה)

- Genesis 22:8 And Abraham said, My son, God will provide **himself** a lamb for a burnt offering: so they went both of them together.

Old Testament Spoke of this Day! - Isaiah 53

Isaiah 53:1-5 Who hath believed our report? and to whom is the arm of the LORD revealed? (2) For he shall grow up before him as a tender plant, and as a root out of a dry ground: he hath no form nor comeliness; and when we shall see him, there is no beauty that we should desire him. (3) **He is despised and rejected of men**; a man of sorrows, and acquainted with grief: and we hid as it were our faces from him; he was despised, and **we esteemed him not**. (4) Surely he hath borne our griefs, and carried our sorrows: yet we did esteem him stricken, smitten of God, and afflicted. (5) **But he was wounded for our transgressions, he was bruised for our iniquities: the chastisement of our peace was upon him; and with his stripes we are healed.**

Old Testament Spoke of this Day! Isaiah 53:3 - “we esteemed him not”

Israel missed Jesus just as today; the name of our Saviour has become a “cuss word”!

- Even churches don't esteem Jesus as their focus is on:
 - What God can do for you to alleviate your problems.
 - Want God to bless what we think is best for us.
 - What can this church do for YOU?
 - Politics

Old Testament **Spoke** of this Day! - **7 FEASTS OF GOD:**
Leviticus 23 - "*God's Calendar of Redemption*"

- 1. Passover:** Death of the Messiah
- 2. Unleavened Bread:** Perfect Life – Burial
- 3. 1st Fruits:** “morrow after the Sabbath” (Lev. 23:11) – Resurrection
- 4. Weeks** (Pentecost): Holy Spirit came!

New Testament Writers Understood the Meaning!

Paul:

- 1 Corinthians 5:7 Purge out therefore the old leaven, that ye may be a new lump, as ye are unleavened. **For even Christ our passover** is sacrificed for us:
- Hebrews 7:27 Who needeth not daily, as those high priests, to offer up sacrifice, first for his own sins, and then for the people's: **for this he did once, when he offered up himself.**
- Hebrews 9:28 So **Christ was once offered to bear the sins of many**; and unto them that look for him shall he appear the second time without sin unto salvation.

New Testament Writers Understood the Meaning!

John and Peter Understood!

- John 1:29 The next day John seeth Jesus coming unto him, and saith, **Behold the Lamb of God**, which taketh away the **sin** of the world.
- 1 Peter 1:19 But with the **precious blood of Christ, as of a lamb without blemish and without spot:**
- Revelation 5:6 And I beheld, and, lo, in the midst of the throne and of the four beasts, and in the midst of the elders, **stood a Lamb as it had been slain...**
- Revelation 5:12 Saying with a loud voice, **Worthy is the Lamb that was slain** to receive power, and riches, and wisdom, and strength, and honour, and glory, and blessing.

Jesus – Monday, 10th Nisan - descended the Mount of Olives on a donkey.

He rode the donkey downhill from “the top Mt. Olives” into Jerusalem.



- As the crowd saw Jesus coming down, they made the Biblical connection.
 - The Lord had promised King David that one of his descendants would sit on his throne forever (2 Samuel 7:1, 11-16).
 - When Solomon took his father’s throne, he did so by riding a mule to the Gihon Spring in the Kidron Valley, where he was anointed king (I Kings 1:32-35).

Similarities between Solomon's procession and Jesus

“And king David said, Call me Zadok the priest, and Nathan the prophet...The **king also said unto them**...cause **Solomon my son to ride upon mine own mule, and bring him down to Gihon**: And let **Zadok** the priest and Nathan the prophet **anoint him there king over Israel**: and blow ye with the trumpet, and say, God save king Solomon.” (1 Kings 1:32-34)

Similarities between Solomon's procession and Jesus

Side Note: The sons of Zadok's lineage (son of Aaron through Kohath—Numbers 3) will lead as priests in the Millennial Temple.

- Ezekiel 44:15 But the priests the Levites, the **sons of Zadok**, that kept the charge of my sanctuary when the children of Israel went astray from me, they shall come near to me to minister unto me, and they shall stand before me to offer unto me the fat and the blood, saith the Lord GOD:
- Ezekiel 48:11 It shall be for **the priests** that are sanctified of the **sons of Zadok**; which have kept my charge, which went not astray when the children of Israel went astray, **as the Levites went astray**.

The line of Eli (Ithamor – 4th son of Aaron) would end – I Samuel 2:27-31.

- 1 Samuel 2:31 Behold, the days come, that I will cut off thine arm, and the arm of thy father's house, that **there shall not be an old man in thine house**.

Solomon rode down the Mount of Olives

He would have gone over the Kidron Valley and turned left to the Gihon Spring.

- Jesus would have also gone over the Kidron Valley but turned right and left of the Southern Wall to enter Jerusalem through the **Sheep's Gate**, not the Eastern Gate.
 - He came as a lamb to be sacrificed.
 - He will return at the 2nd Coming to the Eastern Gate.




The BIG Question - Monday before 6 PM, 10th Day of Nissan

Did Jesus enter through the **Eastern Gate** on His Triumphant march (Monday) from the Mount of Olives?

- I believe He entered through the **“Sheep’s Gate.”** (Rt. side – North)
 - My reasoning is circular - no archaeological evidence.
 - His first coming was as a “lamb” – Birth in Bethlehem!
- 3rd View – Jesus entered through the South Gate as it would be required to go through a mikveh.



Passion Week



- **Waved palm branches**
 - “Took branches of **palm trees**, and went forth to meet him, and cried, Hosanna: Blessed is the King of Israel that cometh in the name of the Lord.” (John 12:13)
 - Did you ever wonder why those who waved palm branches soon “*cried out*” – “Crucify him!” (Mark 15:13) a short time later?
 - Answer: **They had the wrong Feast??**

Passion Week - Two different thoughts on what was happening:



- Palm branches were used for the Feast of Tabernacles **NOT** the Passover!

—“And ye shall take you on the first day the boughs of goodly trees, branches of **palm trees**, and the boughs of thick trees, and willows of the brook; and ye shall rejoice before the LORD your God seven days.”
(Leviticus 23:40)

Passion Week

Palm branches also stood for freedom or deliverance!

- “Judea Capta” Roman coin – (Minted in AD 71):
 - It mocks the defeated Jews with a woman kneeling under a palm tree as a Roman soldier celebrates the capture of Jerusalem.

Israel's understanding of the Messiah was wrong!

Just as today, many individuals (like you and me) have made Jesus' job to help **ME** get better.

- Jesus has become nothing more than our own “god” to do our bidding. (*prosperity preaching*)

Israel wanted Jesus to throw off the yoke of Rome, just as **we wish Jesus to throw off the yoke of bad health, money problems, and marriage problems.**

“And so, my fellow Americans: ask not what your country can do for you — ask what **YOU** can do for your country.”

- **Kennedy** called on all Americans to commit themselves to service and sacrifice.

- The impact of JFK’s speech was a great motivator to Americans who had become indifferent to their country.



- John 19:13-16 When Pilate therefore heard that saying, he brought Jesus forth, and sat down in the judgment seat in a place that is called the Pavement, but in the Hebrew, Gabbatha. 1. “preparation of the passover” – The day before the Passover – so all this had begun “**was**” on Thursday before 6 PM - Nisan 13.

3. What were the soldiers carrying? - “*lanterns and torches*,” showing that it was just about evening.
4. This confirms that the “sixth hour” means midnight as the clock started at 6 PM.
5. They bound Him and brought Jesus to **Annas** (18:13) and then to **Caiaphas**, the high priest (18:24), at the “*judgment hall*” (18:28).
6. Our text states “early” (18:28) as it is still early in the evening.
7. Finally, at midnight (the 6th hour), Jesus is brought before Pilate at the place called the “*pavement*,” where he announces to the Jews, “*Behold your king*” (John 19:14).

Second Problem Text

There are two views that will explain “they might eat the Passover.”

- John 18:28 Then led they Jesus from **Caiaphas** unto the hall of judgment: and it was early; and they themselves went not into the judgment hall, lest they should be defiled; but that **they might eat the passover.**

We know that Jesus ate the Passover with His disciples in the upper room on Thursday night.

- This would have been before His arrest. So how is John 18:28 explained?

- At first glance, it seems that whereas Jesus had eaten the Passover the night before, the Jewish leaders had not yet eaten the Passover – they still “wanted to be able to eat” it after Jesus was arrested. To reconcile this verse with the Synoptic narratives, we must remember this: Passover was the first day of the week-long Feast of Unleavened Bread.
- The Feast (or Festival) of Unleavened Bread (Chag HaMatzot) lasted for a full week, from Nissan 15 to Nisan 22. The first day of Unleavened Bread coincided with the day of Passover. Because of the close relation between Passover and the Feast of Unleavened Bread, the whole week was sometimes referred to as “Passover.” The two holidays were (and still are considered a single

- This explains John 18:28. The Jewish leaders had already eaten the Passover proper, but there still remained other sacrifices to be made and meals to be eaten. They were unwilling to defile themselves (Pilate's palace contained leaven" because it would disqualify them from participating in the remainder of the week's ceremonies.

The above view is a good explanation and has merit. There is a second view that explains it in a better way.

2nd Explanation of John 19:28

The problem in reconciling our text is that there were two main Jewish groups at this time who constantly fought over Bible texts—the Pharisees and Sadducees.

- Both groups did **not** keep the Passover at the same time.

John MacArthur - In his book "*The Murder of Jesus*," refers to this when he stated:

- Jews of Jesus' day had two different methods of reckoning the calendar...The Pharisees, as well as the Jews from Galilee and the northern districts of Israel, counted their days from sunrise to sunrise. But the Sadducees, and people from Jerusalem and the surrounding districts, calculated days from sundown to sundown. That meant 14 Nisan for a Galilean fell on Thursday, while 14 Nisan for the inhabitants of Jerusalem fell on Friday.

2nd Explanation of John 19:28

While I disagree with some of what MacArthur said, he is trying to show the two different groups that participated in the Passover on different days.

- The Sadducees kept the Passover on the 14th - the night before. The Pharisees kept the Feast of Passover the next day.

The key point here is, "Who controlled the Temple worship on that day?" The answer is the Sadducees. So, the timing of Jesus' death on the cross was exactly Biblical, unlike what the Pharisees believed.

Passion Week

Church of St. Peter in Gallicantu

After Jesus' arrest, the soldiers brought Him to Caiaphas, the High Priest (Matt. 26:57).

- The Church of St. Peter in Gallicantu commemorates the denial of Peter (Gallicantu means "rooster crowing").

The **Hinnom Valley** flanks this site, and a monastery is near the valley at Akeldema, the "field of blood" where **Judas hung himself**.








Church of St. Peter in Gallicantu (crowing of the cock) - Dedicated to Peter's denials.





Roman leader Hadrian built the temple of Aphrodite as part of his reconstruction of Jerusalem as Aelia Capitolina in 135 AD.


- Destruction of the Jewish Revolt (70 AD) and Bar Kokhba's revolt (132–135 AD).

Helena rebuilt it (326 AD) and claimed to have found the true cross Jesus was crucified on and Jesus' tomb.

- Church Historian Eusebius (263–339 AD) does **not** mention the cross but states that the **tomb** exhibited *a clear and visible proof* that it was the tomb of Jesus (Eusebius, *Life of Constantine*, Chapter 28)



 - Mark 15:16-20 And the soldiers led him away into the hall, called **Praetorium**; and they call together the whole band. (17) And they clothed him with purple, and platted a crown of thorns, and put it about his head, (18) And began to salute him, Hail, King of the Jews! (19) And they smote him on the head with a reed, and did spit upon him, and bowing their knees worshipped him. (20) And when they had mocked him, they took off the purple from him, and put his own clothes on him, and led him out to crucify him.
- 2. Jesus was forced to carry His own cross – John 19:17-42**
- 3. Denied by Peter three times in all four Gospels –**
 - Matthew 26:33-35, 69-75; Mark 14:29-31, 66-72; Luke 22:31-34, 54-62; John 13:36-38, 18:25-27, 21:15-19.



- Leviticus 23:5 In the fourteenth day of the first month at even is the LORD'S passover.

He arose on Sunday, April 5, 33 AD – Feast of First Fruits - He arose!

- Leviticus 23:11-12 And he shall wave the sheaf before the LORD, to be accepted for you: on the morrow after the sabbath the priest shall wave it. (12) And ye shall offer that day when ye wave the sheaf an he lamb without blemish of the first year for a burnt offering unto the LORD.

Epilogue: Harold Hoehner, "Chronological Aspects of the Life of Christ"

Let's do the math! Here are the qualifiers:

1. 7 Sabbaths (49 days) + "the morrow after the Sabbath" = 50 days
– (Pente means 50)
2. Prophecy is 30 days in a month based on the Flood.
3. Day of Pentecost (Acts 2) – 50 Days from the Feast of First Fruits

Our dates based on Hoehner:

1. **Sunday, April 5, 33 AD – Feast of First Fruits**
2. **Sunday, May 24, 33 AD – Feast of Pentecost**
- April 5 (Resurrected) to end of the month (30 days) = **26 days**
(counting April 5)
- **May 1 to 24 = 24 days** – So 26 plus 24 = **50 Days**

NOTE: Pharisees start their count from the Feast of Passover, not the First Feasts
